From the lion's den...

John 1: 5: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Dear Friends in Christ and Fellow Ministers,

As you are reading this, we are approaching the end of "The 12 Days of Christmas" and the beginning of the third "Season of Light: Epiphany." On Sunday, January 8th, we will hear the Epiphany readings; the story of the wise men, the magi. Epiphany means, "to reveal". The readings reveal who this Jesus of Nazareth really is.

In February we will leave the seasons of light and walk into the darkness, into the "valley of the shadow of death" with Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. But some of us experience this darkness even during The Christmas Season. We have lost loved ones; or we have experienced other loss in our life. We are not holding a "Blue Christmas" service this season. But we are aware. You are part of a family, a church family. You are part of the family of God gathered as Prince of Peace. We are friends in Christ and Fellow Ministers. As I type this message, I am preparing my sermon for the last Sunday of Advent. In his Gospel account, Matthew quotes Isaiah chapter 7. Emmanuel is coming. Maranatha! The Lord has come; the Lord is here now; the Lord will come again. You are never alone. God is with you. But your family in God is also with you.

We celebrate this truth at Christmas. But this truth is a source of strength throughout the year. The Advent gifts from God each year are: Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. And, the character traits of a thriving congregation in this challenging time are: Hope, Courage, Trust and Truth. When we come together in worship on Sunday morning we mutually share in these gifts, and these traits. It all begins with Hope. Our theme this program year is: Hope is Here! Church comes from a Greek word which means "the gathered – sent ones". We gather Sunday to receive the gifts and encouragement of God by The Holy Spirit, and are sent back into the world to share those gifts and that encouragement – that Hope. It all begins with Hope.

The message of The Seasons of Light is: in the end, Light wins. The message of the Season of Lent is: in the end, Love wins. The message of the Season of Resurrection power is: in the end, Life wins. God is with us.
